SURGICAL TEAMS BREAK RECORD WITH **NEARLY 10,000 SURGERIES IN A YEAR**

Methodist Dallas performed a record number of surgeries in fiscal year 2023. Surgeons on the hospital's medical staff performed a total of 9,951 surgeries from September 2022 through September 2023.

"I am so proud of our surgical teams at Methodist Dallas," said President John Phillips, FACHE. "The physicians on the medical staff and surgical services staff at Methodist Dallas are committed to working together to provide our patients with quality, efficient, and compassionate care."

Last May alone, surgical teams performed 920 surgeries, the hospital's highest number of surgeries for a single month.

"Because of our incredible support and medical staff, the best days for Methodist Dallas are ahead of us," Phillips said.





RADIOLOGY TEAM EARNS SEAL OF EXCELLENCE

Methodist Dallas earned a new designation as a Comprehensive Radiopharmaceutical Therapy Center of Excellence.

Important efforts by the nuclear medicine team helped the hospital meet guidelines set by the Society of Nuclear Medicine and Molecular Imaging. The program recognizes institutions that have reliable access to high-quality radiopharmaceutical therapy delivered by multidisciplinary teams.

"This designation is a great accomplishment for Methodist Dallas. It reflects the leadership across the organization and the hard work of the nuclear therapy team," says Alexandru Bageac, MD, Department Chair of Radiology at Methodist Dallas. "Methodist Dallas has joined a select group of academic institutions that provide this therapy without being part of a university-centered healthcare system."

Methodist Dallas is one of two sites in Dallas-Fort Worth to earn this designation.

OVER \$10 MILLION IN FUNDRAISING TO TRANSFORM WOMEN'S AND CHILDREN'S UNIT

The Methodist Health System Foundation pulled out all the stops to transform Methodist Dallas' labor and delivery unit. First in April, the 2023 Robert S. Folsom Leadership Award celebrated Mary and Rich Templeton for their many accomplishments and raised over \$2 million to enhance the Women's and Children's Services floor at Methodist Dallas. In addition to that fundraiser, a \$1.1 million grant from the Crystal Charity Ball helped the Foundation surpass its goal of \$10 million to enhance the unit.

"We are grateful to all of our donors for supporting this project with so much enthusiasm and generosity," said Methodist Health System Foundation President **Jim Johnston**.

The Crystal Charity Ball grant will go toward work on 3 Schenkel Tower and the creation of an Obstetrics Emergency

"Collaboration between our Women and Children's leadership and the Foundation created an opportunity to fast-track our goal to fully fund the labor and delivery project at Methodist Dallas," said President John Phillips, FACHE. "I'm excited for our medical staff who will soon welcome new lives in a new space."

Construction began in mid-March and will last through the end of the year.

METHODIST DALLAS NAMED CENTER OF EXCELLENCE FOR PANCREATIC CARE

The National Pancreas Foundation recognized Methodist Dallas Medical Center as an approved Center of Excellence, the only hospital in Dallas-Fort Worth to be distinguished for its treatment of both pancreatitis and pancreatic cancer.

The newest distinction is the result of a rigorous audit and highlights Methodist Dallas' multidisciplinary care of pancreatitis - treating the "whole patient" with a focus on achieving the best possible outcome and an improved quality of life.

"Accreditation from the National Pancreas Foundation is an important symbol of Methodist Dallas Medical Center's commitment to high-quality, multidisciplinary pancreas care," said Alejandro Mejia, MD, Executive Director of Organ Transplantation at Methodist Dallas.



An approved NPF center meets the criteria developed by a task force of subject matter experts and patient advocates. Requirements include having specialized physicians such as gastroenterologists, pancreas surgeons, and interventional radiologists, as well as more patient-focused programs such as a pain management service and psychosocial support.

"For many years, Methodist Dallas has thoroughly demonstrated a high level of care for patients with pancreas disease," said Paul Tarnasky, MD, executive medical director of the Methodist Digestive Institute. "We look forward to continuing to develop our pancreas Center of Excellence and providing this superior level of care to patients in North Texas and beyond."
