METHODIST RICHARDSON BUILDS ON GROWTH

The construction crane that for so long hovered over Methodist Richardson is gone but not forgotten. The crane had been in place for much of 2023 for the \$46 million project to expand the lab, pharmacy, and Emergency Department.

The first phase was completed in June when 10 new ER beds opened for patient care. The next phase was completed in early October when the lab and pharmacy moved into their new third floor space.

“While progress is always good, I have to admit I was a little sad to see the crane come down,” said Methodist Richardson President **Ken Hutchenrider, FACHE**. “It just represents that good things are happening here.”

Another \$30 million project at Methodist Richardson is well underway to finish out the fifth-floor shell space, adding 75 all-private patient suites. It will be complete by summer. That project is concurrent with the final phase of the ER expansion that will add 10 more beds, including five trauma rooms.



REMODELED CATH LAB OPENS

Methodist Richardson’s newly remodeled cardiac catheterization lab No. 2 is up and running.

The new and improved lab is part of Methodist Richardson’s capital investment campaign to enhance cutting-edge technology that advances the hospital’s goal to offer high-quality cardiovascular services to the community. The hospital currently has three cardiac cath labs total.

“Our team has decades of experience performing these complex procedures,” says **Nhan Nguyen, MD**, Medical Director of Cardiology. “Now we’re able to do these procedures in a brand-new environment with the latest tools and techniques, which will improve patient care.”

The \$3.5 million renovation project replaced and updated all of the equipment that was moved from the Campbell Road location after the Bush/Renner campus opened in 2014.

METHODIST RICHARDSON FOUNDATION CELEBRATES GALA IN SAUCY STYLE

Things heated up at Methodist Richardson Medical Center Foundation’s Call for Compassion (formerly Yellow & Black-Tie Gala) in September. The \$370,408 raised for the evening will help expedite a new 3D mammography machine to meet the increasing demand Methodist Richardson Cancer Center sees for breast cancer screening. The remaining funds and those from a successful North Texas Giving Day will be applied to early screening for other cancers like colorectal, lung, and skin cancers. The honorary host, **Jenevieve Hughes, MD**, kicked off the successful fundraising with a lively round of auctions and games.

FAITH COMMUNITY NURSING

Through local churches, Methodist Health System provides education and health outreach, including flu shots and biometric screenings.

METHODIST GENERATIONS

ASIAN BREAST HEALTH OUTREACH PROJECT (ABHOP)
